2009 ROCKY FLATS MUSEUM BOARD OFFICERS ELECTED

The 2009 officers of the Rocky Flats Cold War Museum include president, Shirley Garcia of Broomfield's Environmental Services Division; vice-president Don Rohlf of Arvada, a Rocky Flats retiree; secretary, Ann Lockhart of Denver, writer/editor; and treasurer, Doug Parker of Arvada, a Rocky Flats retiree.

Garcia worked at the Rocky Flats Nuclear Weapons Plant for 15 years. Rohlf worked in purchasing cost analysis at Rocky Flats for 30 years and belongs to the Homesteaders, the Rocky Flats retiree group. Lockhart, the museum board's immediate past president, retired from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment in public relations and on the Historical Public Exposures Studies on Rocky Flats. Parker, who retired from Rocky Flats after 23 years, works part-time for Boulder County's Household Hazardous Waste Unit.

The museum board is working to develop an exhibit on Rocky Flats planned for June 2010 at the Arvada Center for the Arts and the Humanities. Donations of artifacts related to Rocky Flats or the Cold War are welcome. The board recently signed a lease for Arvada storage space for its collection of artifacts and for a meeting/work room.
